The 'Our Father begins 'who art in heaven'. The original prayer the word used by Jesus was the Hebrew word 'abba' which means 'daddy' or 'papa'. The

scholarly translators could not accept the idea of Jesus teaching us to address our Father in such an informal way. The emphasis was changed from the familiar to a remote and respected titular figure who is more distant and removed. 'Give us this day, our daily bread' refers to the Jewish practice of eating three loaves of bread a day. In the Gospel of Luke, Chap. 11 verses 5 & 6, a friend asks for "three loaves of bread" to feed an unexpected guest.

There are great truths and riches hidden away in this familiar prayer that we all drone away (often on auto pilot) each week. Really looking at this prayer and learning even a bit about the cultural inheritance behind the words help bring it back to life for us in our world today.

Jan. 30. 2019; The Catholic Civil Rights League (CCRL) presented arguments at the Ontario Court of Appeal in support of Physicians Conscience Rights. Despite a Lower Court findings that the religious freedom of doctors had been infringed upon the CCRL argued on behalf of objecting doctors who question provisions of the objectionable procedures such as abortion or assisted suicide. The Chief Justice of Ontario has reserved its final decision to a later date.

Excerpts from a New Years' letter from the Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson, Jan. 2019.

The Supreme Knight speaks of the past when Catholics were questioned if they would make good citizens or honest public servants. From our founding in 1882 to Br. John F. Kennedy's election in 1960 it was still questioned if Catholics were fit for public office. Throughout that time, the kofc countered such prejudice. As recent as 2017, a Notre Dame Law Professor was deemed unfit for a federal judgeship by a US Senator and lately, two more Senators have questioned a Brother Knight's fitness for a

federal bench because our Order holds firm to the Church's teachings on the sanctity of life and marriage. It is regretful that in spite of our faith and the work the kofc have carried out since its founding we are still subjected to such mistrust. Considering the charitable work our Order has carried out along with the millions of dollars and hundreds of millions of volunteer work at home and abroad it is difficult to fathom the mentality of our adversaries. In the words of our Supreme Knight; "Let us remember that from our founding, we have embodied the truth that a good Catholic is a good citizen who shows civility and dignity even in the face of prejudice "
