June 2019 will see the 50th Anniversary of the Church of the Ascension. We are all looking forward to marking this event in our history.

As we know, the present Church of the Ascension serves approximately 520 families and individual households. The Church resulted from an amalgamation of two smaller churches, the St. Theresa-Church of the Little Flower in Qualicum Beach, established in 1935 and the St. John Vianney in Parksville formed in 1948. Funds were raised to purchase land and the present Church of the Ascension was built in 1969. The first priest of (Ascension) was Fr. Jan Planeta who arrived in the area in February 1968. Fr. Planeta was born in Poland in 1909 and entered the seminary at the age of 19. He was ordained as a priest in 1934. In 1939 with the German invasion.

of Poland he was arrested and sent to Dachau Concentration Camp. Upon arrival he was told "there is no exit from this camp, except through the chimney of the crematorium". Due to the brutal conditions, beatings and starvation along with being used as a human guinea pig his weight dropped to 86 Lbs. Dachau had a separate area known as the 'Priest Barracks of Dachau' KZ Dachau. The 'Pfarrerblock' – 'Priesterblock' was created in December 1940 and became the Centre of imprisonment of clergymen. Of a total of 2720 recorded imprisonments of religious people at Dachau, 2.579 or 94.88 % were Roman Catholic. There were 109 Protestants, 22 Greek Orthodox. 8 Old Catholic-Mariavites and 2 Muslims. Members of the Catholic Society of Jesus (Jesuits) were the largest group. As we know, no words or pictures can ever reveal the extreme suffering of the thousands who were crowded in Dachau. The living conditions were unbelievable, no food, no sanitation and death all around. The Camp was liberated by US troops on April 29th 1945. It was the last concentration camp to be set free. The Barracks were converted into hospitals and it was months before many could be moved. Fr. Planeta joined the 'Polish Panzers' and eventually became chaplain of the military camp at Westphalen Germany. He then joined

the 52nd British Division becoming senior chaplain with the rank of Captain. In 1950, Fr. Planeta came to Victoria and became Assistant Priest at St. Andrews.

In June 1970, Fr. Planeta was replaced by Fr. Kevin Wiseman who remained as Parish Priest at Ascension until 1984. Fr. Wiseman had another interesting background. He was born in England in 1921 and was educated in Belgium and France. At an early stage he was attracted to the priesthood. Sadly, while with the 'White Fathers' at a French Seminary school he was caught in the German invasion in 1940 and was arrested. He spent the next couple of years in prisoner of war camps. Twice he was condemned to death but somehow managed to survive and was pardoned. He later served on several missions in Africa before coming the BC to visit family. Fr. Wiseman was a clergyman for 40 years. A book on Fr. Wiseman's life history is available in the Parish Library. Since 1984 we have been privileged to welcome a number of pastoral leaders to Ascension: 1984 – Fr. Paul Blanchard: 1987 – Fr. Ray Cunningham; 1998 – Fr. Michael Favero; 2004 – Fr. 2019-5-10; CNS; Pope Francis told the heads of women's religious orders from around the globe the sisters are needed to serve the church and those in need and should not be 'servants or maids'.



On the World Scene;

This has been a particularly difficult Easter for many Christians around the Globe. The shocking death of 350 people and destruction in Sri Lanka rings terribly familiar in this era of Christian persecution. As commented by C. Pepinster 'The Telegraph' on April 23, 19', according to a respected Research Center 'Christians are the most targeted body of believers in 144 countries. The future of Christianity is grim in N.Africa and the Middle East. In Libya, a mass grave contained 34 Ethiopian Christians killed by Islamic State Fighters. The destruction of Christianity in Iraq after Islamist groups emerged has resulted in barely any Christians left in cities like Mosul.

Fr. Raymond J. deSouza stated in his 25 April 19' article to the National Post. "In 2018, French police reported **875** churches vandalized. Though the Notre Dame de Paris fire was

deemed to be accidental, another prominent church in Paris was burned while another was smeared with excrement and sacrileges against the Holy Eucharist.

During an Easter procession in Gombe, Nigeria, a car rammed into a group of children killing 9 people and injuring another 30.

On Palm Sunday 2019 a church in Uttar Pradesh, India was attacked by some 200 men who beat the pastor and congregation with sticks.

In April, the Catholic Civil Rights League noted the introduction of proposed legislation to force all religious symbols to be removed by specific public sector workers in the Prov. Of Quebec.(ccrl@ccrl.ca 19-04-07)

Matthew Kelly, a well-known author, speaker and consultant, commented in one of his books 'The Biggest Lie in the History of Christianity' that, "Christian unity will be needed to make the world a better place. It is no longer just a nice idea; it is the moral imperative upon which the future of Christianity depends. Yes, the world is in a mess and Yes, people see the outlook as grim but we as Christians should not look upon the world as grim. Christians are people of hope."
