On days of fast, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's own needs. Eating between meals is not allowed although fluids may be taken. Lent is a penitential season and as such, religious practices such as daily Mass, the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Stations of the Cross, works of Charity and Justice, and acts of self-denial are highly encouraged.

.Pope Francis recently completed a successful visit to Mexico where he celebrated his first Mass before Our Lady of Guadalupe.

During a brief stop-over at Havana, Cuba, Pope Francis met with Russian Orthodox Patriarch Kirill of Moscow at the Havana airport for a long awaited discussion after two decades of Vatican overtures to bring a Pope and a Russian Patriarch together. Both signed a joint declaration emphasizing issues the two churches have in common.



Much discussion has taken place in recent months regarding the Pancake Breakfasts organized by the Knights' Council 7991. Due to budgetary restraints the Parish can only support 2 Breakfast events for this year. As a result our Council has decided to consolidate the 3 breakfast Teams into 2. EUTHANASIA PREVENTION COALITION:

The issue of Assisted Suicide continues to be a major concern for our Church and Community. Representation to the Minister of Justice is being made to insist the Federal Government ensure that laws and regulations protect the conscience rights of individuals and institutions that cannot participate in any form in assisted suicide legislation.

The Catholic Civil Rights League (CCRL) strongly opposes recommendations of the Report of the Special Joint Committee on Physician-Assisted Dying. According to the CCRL, the Joint Committee's majority recommends the practically unfettered and immediate implementation of death on demand for Canadians. The League fears for the elderly, the disabled and those with mental health afflictions, that they may experience increased pressure to take their own lives rather than gain access to treatment or palliative care. Catholic health institutions cannot and will not participate in the intrinsically evil act of assisted suicide/euthanasia. (The CCRL founded in 85' as an independent non-profit lay organization)
