Introducing **Rum Hykaway** - the Grand Knight of KofC - Council 7991.

Rum was born at Gimli, Mb. in 1938 to Ukrainian and Polish parents. The family farm was expropriated by the Gov't during the early yrs. of WWII. The family moved to Wpg. where Rum attended Elementary School. Rum's father had an entrepreneurial spirit and moved the family to Selkirk. Mb. where he entered the Hotel Business. Rum attended Jnr. and Snr. High Schools in Selkirk. Upon graduating from High School Rum commuted to Wpg. where he studied electronics in College. In 1963 Cdn. Aviation Electronics, the company he worked for transferred him and his family to Edmonton Alta. In 1964 Rum left the electronics trade ioining a drilling rig manufacturing Co. out of Enid. Okla. with its Canadian Head office in

Radio broadcasting had always been Rum's passion and having worked as a part time news reader for a radio station in Wpg. he joined a group of young broadcast entrepreneurs. They applied for and received a licence from the CRTC to establish and operate an AM radio station in the Edmonton/Jasper areas. In 1974, Rum left his Co. and moved to Vancouver Island where he took over the AM radio station in Duncan. In addition to several retail businesses as well as radio Rum later sold his business interests and joined an AM radio station in Victoria. At the same time he purchased a radio station in Saskatchewan. In the mid-eighties Rum moved back to Victoria where he obtained a Real Estate licence and spent the next 15 yrs. in Victoria's Real Estate. In addition to Real Estate Rum and his oldest son operated a Marina Pub and Restaurants in Duncan and Nanaimo. Following retirement in the early 2000's Rum keeps busy on a part time basis in the automobile industry. In 2015 Rum married Carol LOW and they reside in Qualicum Beach with 'Joaquin', the cat. Carol and Rum are keen RV'ers and enjoy visiting family as well as their association with the KofC and the CWL.

At a recent sermon Fr. Favero spoke of 'Twelfth-Night Cakes'. We set to work seeking more info and a Recipe courtesy of the trusty old 'Larousse Gastronomique'. We found the Twelfth Night Cake or best known as Gateaux Des Rois has a long tradition, was well known at Christmas, New Year and Twelfth Night rites. The mystical significance of the festivals is less known today and few now chant when 'the king' drinks;

"Laus au Roy! Nous la lui devons Il a beu dru!..A nous! beuvons" Translation' "Laud the king, we owe it to him, He has drunk lustily, It is our turn now. Come let us drink"

Several rituals were associated with the custom of serving this cake and today the practise varies in different regions of France. The 12th Night commemorates the arrival of the Magi, who, led by a star came to offer gifts to the new born Christ.



Here's the Recipe ;Bordeaux Twelfth Night Cake;

3.1/4 sifted flour, 1 cup butter, 20 grams of yeast, 1 cup sugar, 8 whole eggs, 2 tbsp. salt 1 grated lemon rind, Make a ring of the flour on the table, Add the yeast and salt, Mix well. Knead the dough, adding the eggs one at a time. Add the lemon rind and sugar, a little at a time. Add the softened butter. Mix it all, the dough should be fairly limp. Place in a bowl, cover with a cloth and let rise overnight in a warm place. Next day -break down the dough, divide into equal parts. Traditionally these pieces should be formed into the shape of a crown which can be decorated with a thin slice of lemon sprinkled with granulated sugar. Place on buttered parchment paper. Leave to rise in a warm spot for several hours, brush the tops of

each section of dough with a beaten egg. Bake in a medium oven. The head of the house has the honour to cut and serve the cake.

OPEN FORUM;

FROM THE NATIONAL FRONT;

Dec 1, 2017 - Catholic Civil Rights League; The CCRL presented arguments before the Supreme Court of Canada as interveners in the Trinity Western Univ. Law School case. A decision by the SCC is expected in Spring 2018. This will be a significant high court decision pertaining to religious freedom. (see www.ccrl.ca for more details)

Jan 11, 2018 CCRL; The Canada Summer Jobs Program fiasco is another example of the Govt's abortion absolutism. To be eligible for the 2018 Summer Jobs Program, prospective employers, largely charities must attest that the 'core mandate of the organization' respects 'reproductive rights and the right to be free from discrimination on the basis of sex, religion, race, national or ethnic origin, colour, sexual orientation or gender identity or expression. The document is explicit included under 'reproductive rights' is 'the right to access safe

and legal abortions'.. The CCRL has stated that 'no such right' is part of either the Charter of Rights and Freedoms or of case law. Also, unfettered access to abortion is not supported by a majority of Canadians. A 'Environics/Life Canada poll' indicates that 6 out of 10 Cdns support protection for the unborn at some stage of pregnancy. (see www.ccrl.ca)

Jan 31, 2018; CCRL; Several religious physicians in Ontario have challenged the mandate of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario that requires doctors who object to certain procedures on religious or conscientious grounds such as assisted suicide, to provide nevertheless, an 'effective referral' to another physician or caregiver who would perform the service. The Ont. Divisional Court upheld the policy that requires life affirming physicians to act against their religion and conscience. This is an alarming development as it places Ont. doctors at risk of professional complaints for refusing to make such referrals. (see www.ccrl.ca Jan 31, 2018)

Cath.Register Nov 26th, 2017 Art. by G. Argan. "The Cath. church in Alberta and the NDP Gov't are deeply at odds. The differences involve revision of the provincial sex education curriculum, as well as new legislation on gay-straight alliances. As well, there is Premier Rachel Notley's insulting characterization of a Catholic sex education proposal as giving moral legitimacy to rape"
