KNIGHTS IN ACTION;

Brother Oliver J. Perumal: Br. Oliver was born in Sri Lanka and migrated to Canada in 1965 settling in Calgary, Alta. where he worked for the City of Calgary until age 55 when he moved to Qualicum Beach, B.C. Due to a stroke he decided to avoid Canadian winters and after searching for a suitable place he chose Sri Lanka. He has been a member of Council 7991 since 2011 and a 4th Degree Knight since 2013. He spent the last 15 or 16 winters in Sri Lanka. In 2015 he noted that an English teacher was needed for the children in Kelaniya, a Colombo suburb. Br. Oliver was contacted by 'GURUGEDARA' (House of Teaching), a volunteer organization. He agreed to teach as a volunteer, raised money to build a school which was completed but, the great floods of 2015/16 ' devastated the project. The Gov't of Sri Lanka granted them a piece of land, money was again raised and a two story structure was completed. On one of his travels in Sri Lanka he returned to the Eastern Province and there, the folks were Tamil, mostly Christian who could not speak or understand the English language. Returning to Colombo he received a call to return to KOMARI. Here he adopted a Christian family with three children and was travelling 17 kms to attend Mass at St. Anthony's Catholic church in POTTUVIL. Here he realized that the young priest did not have a decent chalice or ciborium. and he contacted, Fr. Karam Alraban at Parksville, B.C. to inquire whether it was possible to donate a chalice, ciborium, cruets, altar cross, etc. Lo' and behold, he received a very encouraging response. Fr. Karam subsequently contacted His Grace Gary Gordon, the Bishop in Victoria, B.C. and with his blessings and approval, upon his return in April 2017 these items were at his home. He packed up the items and upon his return to Sri Lanka in Sept. 2017, he presented them to Fr. P. Suhanthan who was overjoyed and grateful for this valuable donation which he regularly uses at Holy Mass. Fr. Suhanthan was also the Parish Priest for two other churches in the Province, one of

which was St. Michael the Archangel Catholic Church in KOMARI. He was approached by some ladies and asked to provide the church with a sound system, which he did in time for the church feast in October 2017. During the Lenten season, Br. Oliver realized the little church, to which he is now attached, did not have a complete Stations of the Cross since most pieces had been destroyed during the Tsunami in 2004. He contacted the Grand Knight of our Council 7991 resulting in the 14 Stations of the Cross being presented at the June 7th, 2018, General Meeting which he will be taking along upon his return to KOMARI in Sept. 2018. It may be noted that Br. P. Horsfield, Council 7991 was instrumental in locating the Stations of the Cross. It must be added that in 2011, while attending St. Anthony's Parish in COLPETTY, Colombo he noted the Roman Missal looked aged and the Pastor could not afford to purchase a new one. He approached Council 7991 and during Fr. Mel's period of service at the Church of Ascension in Parksville a new Missal was purchased by the Council, Blessed by Fr. Mel and taken to Sri Lanka in September 2012.

With God's Blessing, Br. Oliver hopes to continue spending winters in Sri Lanka and help the folks in this Tsunami affected Province as and when the need arises.

"Things are coming back to normal in Humboldt. There is still a lot of healing needed but time will help. Humboldt Broncos are going to have a team for the 2018-2019 season, they hope that the League lets Humboldt play Nipawin their first game as that is the team that they were to play the day of the accident. There is still money coming in from different things that took place. As far as the Broncos and families go, they are taken care of pretty much. Any money that the Humboldt Council receives we are going to give to 'Stars' for their needs as I don't know what is was like for them to deal with all this too. The city is thinking of up-grading the ball diamonds in honor of the Broncos. If anyone wishes to donate I will forward it on to 'Stars'. I have a cheque from St. Peters Council at Woodbridge, Ont. to give to 'Stars' already. The Humboldt Council just after the accident put on a Breakfast and raised \$7,000.00 that was given to the Broncos organization. The community really came out to support the cause and to comfort one another.

The Catholic Register. Oct 1, 17' commented that Canada's Bishops will not be inviting Pope Francis to visit Canada in the near future. Bishop D. Crosby spoke of the ongoing

controversy and response to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

Article from the National Post; May 9th, 2018 by Mario Silva, a former MP. The headline reads; "Demands for a papal apology border on anti-Catholic bigotry. The federal NDP Caucus apparently supported by PM Trudeau and members of his Liberal caucus are seeking to summon Pope Francis to Canada to apologize in person for the role of the RC church in Canada in the Residential School system. It seems the expression of regret by Pope Benedict in 2009 is apparently not good enough for some Parliamentarians. Mr. Silva asks why; "Years after the Pope expressed his sorrow, some of our politicians are still singling out the Pontiff which raises the question; Why him? Why Catholics? It seems that no other institution, religious or otherwise, is as easily attacked by Canadian politicians as the Catholic Church". If Canada's Parliament adopt the NDP logic, will it issue a summons to Queen Elizabeth II, the 'defender of the Faith and head of the Anglican Church? In 2008 PM S. Harper issued an apology on behalf of the Cdn Gov't. Provincial Governments have also since apologized. In 2009 after meeting with the Cdn. First Nations leader P. Fontaine, Pope Benedict XVI issued an expression of sorrow for the role of the RC Church in Canada in the residential school system. Other denominations have apologized and expressed regrets. Mr. Silva adds; "Horrible crimes were committed against vulnerable children. No one denies this. In fact, it's the opposite, the crimes have been acknowledged and apologized for. It is time for some of Canada's politicians to focus on true reconciliation and healing instead of using tragedy for political posturing."
