10 steps to managing a car accident



1 Stop.
Always wear the seat belt.

2 Stay calm.
Continue to wear a seat belt, then check for damage.



3 Check surroundings.
Watch for oncoming traffic and turn on your hazard lights to warn them.



4 Call for help.
If the accident is serious, call 911.

5 Address injuries.
Keep injured people nearby and don't move them unless there's an immediate danger.



6 Gather info.
Once you know everyone is okay, or emergency help is on the way, gather information to file an accident report using the car accident checklist.

7 File a report.
Call the police to file an accident report even for a minor accident. Note on time and when to report car news checks with your insurance.



8 Take pictures.
Include photos of:
→ damage to vehicles → all vehicles in the accident
→ the scene of the accident → the other driver(s) and passengers

9 Move your vehicle.
Get it out of the flow of traffic, if you can do so safely. If it's too damaged to drive, have it towed.



10 Limit discussion.
Try not to talk about the accident with the other driver, including apologizing to them. Only discuss the accident with the police and your insurance company.
