




Grand Knights Report

Middle East; CWN Dec 14, The Fides news service reports at least 17 Christian churches in Syria have been destroyed or desecrated by Islamist extremists since that country's civil war began. Documented attacks on houses of worship include cases in which churches were burned to the ground or dynamited and some in which icons and relics were deliberately targeted for destruction.

In November 15' the Knights Of Columbus announced that they surpassed \$100 Billion in Life Insurance, culminating a year of record-breaking sales. The KofC is now the world's largest Catholic fraternal organization with almost 1.9 million members across the globe.

In Sept. 15' the KofC informed that a one month supply of food would be sent to the estimated 13, 500 refugee families in Erbil, Iraq who have been displaced by ISIS.

Sept. 15' ; the US Court of Appeals issued a 2-1 ruling stating that the 'BIG MOUNTAIN JESUS' statue in Whitefish, Montana could remain on federal land. The statue was erected by the Knights of Columbus almost 60 yrs ago to commemorate the US Army's 10th Mountain Division that fought in Italy during WWII.

Helen has become involved with Meals on Wheels, about 30 people get dinner 3 times a week. I have also joined a group who bring Communion to the Hospital. Tuesday, 8th December, the feast of the Immaculate Conception was a Holy Day of Obligation here. It may be the nearest Sunday the feast in held in Canada. The only Mass with Music is at 12 Noon on a Sunday but Helen hasn't gone into that one..yet!

BC Catholic News 15 Dec 2015,' B.C. Supreme Court rules in favour of Trinity Western University. Following years of effort to gain recognition the Supreme Court had reversed its April 2014 decision citing 'concerns about discrimination against potential LGBT students. The TWU took the Law Society to Court. The Justice Centre for Constitutional Freedoms intervened in the court case and argued that the Charter gives groups the rights to establish their own membership requirements. That includes TWU's community covenant which some called discriminatory for asking students to abstain from sex outside marriage between a man and a woman. TWU says Alberta, Sask. P.E.I, N.B. and the Yukon will recognize their law graduates. Nova Scotia and Ontario law societies are still in the courts.



Christmas Candles in Windows? Dec.17, 15' Cath. Exchange.com; Fr. W. Saunders explains the custom began as a result of British persecution against the Catholic Church in Ireland after King Henry II invaded Ireland in 1171. The intent was to totally subjugate the Irish people, crush their religion which meant crushing the Catholic Church. The penal laws were extended to eradicate Catholicism. All

Catholic clergy were ordered to leave the country by May 1, 1698 after which they could be imprisoned and exiled and liable to hanging if they returned. Despite the persecution, the Catholic faith kept the Irish strong. Bishops and Priests continued to minister to the people. During Christmas every faithful Irish Catholic family hoped to have a priest visit their home so that they could receive the sacraments. They would leave their doors unlocked and place candles in the windows to signal a priest that he was welcome and would be safe. The practise was brought to America by the Irish immigrants and has become very popular. We must never lose sight of its meaning. As we celebrate Christmas, may we open our hearts and homes to Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Christ is our light, who entered this world to scatter sin and darkness. Having been enlightened by Christ through Holy Baptism, we must have a strong loyalty to our Church. We too must realize that the greatest gift of all is faith, a faith which enabled the Irish to triumph over the most heinous persecutions. (see Arlington Catholic Herald- Fr. W. Saunders)

A nationwide (USA) survey conducted by Marist Poll sponsored and funded by the KofC Dec. 15' finds that Americans are well aware of ISIS atrocities against Christians and other Minorities in the Middle East and believe those actions to constitute genocide. The survey supports agreement that this targeting of Christians and other minorities meets the U.N. definition of genocide. The US Commission on International Religious Freedom released a statement urging the State Dept. to declare what is happening in the region as genocide. During his recent trip to Bolivia Pope Francis stated "Today we are dismayed to see how the Middle East and elsewhere in the world many of our brothers and sisters are persecuted, tortured and killed for their faith in Jesus..A form of genocide is taking place, and it must end".
